- EU specific challenges: open space with 28 member states responsible for security, 28 governments and different territorial organizations, 24 official languages.....

What are standards ?

- Documents providing, specifications, guidelines or characteristics that can be used consistently to ensure that materials, products, processes and services are fit for their purpose.
- Standards are concrete and shared outcomes, workable for all stakeholders developed by consensus of experts
- Investments and powerful lever to strengthen societal security

What can Standards achieve ?

- Common language
- Harmonized processes and practices
- Developing and taking up useful and used research and innovation
- Technical compatibility of material or interoperability of systems or data
- More cost-effective outcomes for both end-users and suppliers
- Shared methods of characterization of products or services
- Shared conformity assessment means (certification, accreditation)
- Shared solutions to societal, commercial or technical Issues
- Trust between stakeholders (users, first responders, policy makers, providers, suppliers, EU Institutions, Research Projects, Citizens...)
